MARIANNE:

BRANDON:

hello, did you find it ok?

MARIANNE:

yes, i'm glad you **made it**

BRANDON:

oh yeah, i'm late? sorry

MARIANNE:

you **look** handsome

BRANDON:

you **look** amazing

WAITER:

hi **how are you doing** tonight?

MARIANNE:

thank you

WAITER:

i have a few specials on the menu, **if you'd like to** hear them?

BRANDON:

sure

WAITER:

um, the soup of the day is tomato, with basil, oil and parmesan crostini;
the special is marinated swordfish, tabouli and **Moroccan chamola**;
it's really good;

we're also serving a tabraga and spitler new york strip with a side order of fries, and a salad with snow peas and radish with a side of vinaigrette; can i start you off with a sparkling water?

WAITER:

BRANDON:
do you want some wine?

MARIANNE:
sure

BRANDON:
white? red?

MARIANNE:
red? maybe...

WAITER:
pinot noir is light, if you like it, like, light.

BRANDON:
great

WAITER:
ok, i'll be back

BRANDON:
so, where do you live?

MARIANNE:
brooklyn

BRANDON:
nice

MARIANNE:
born and raised
where are you from?

BRANDON:
i was born in ireland and we moved here when i was a teen

MARIANNE:
do you get back much? - thank you

BRANDON:
a couple of times

MARIANNE:
big family? do you miss them?

BRANDON:
i have a sister

MARIANNE:
i have two

BRANDON:
oh yeah?

MARIANNE:
yeah

BRANDON:
older? younger?

MARIANNE:
older and younger, i'm in the middle...what?

BRANDON:
just wondering

MARIANNE:
you nervous?

BRANDON:
why would i be nervous?

MARIANNE:
well, you look a little nervous

BRANDON:
do i? no

MARIANNE:
well, it's a date

BRANDON:
it's no big deal

MARIANNE:
it took me an hour to figure out what to wear

BRANDON:
you chose wisely

WAITER:
i'm sorry, but i forgot to say, the crab comes in the shell

BRANDON:
great...
oh, i haven't even looked at this

MARIANNE:
um, i'll have the lamb

WAITER:
the lamb

BRANDON:
i'll have the lamb too; that sounds great

WAITER:
ok, um, no appetizer?

MARIANNE:
i'm fine

WAITER:
ok, how would you like the lamb?

BRANDON:
medium

WAITER:
well, we recommend it pretty pink

BRANDON:
ok

WAITER:
ok, pink it is; thank you, excuse me

BRANDON:
so, are you seeing anyone at the moment?

MARIANNE:
no, are you seeing anyone?

BRANDON:
no

MARIANNE:
no? really? why is that?

BRANDON:
i don't know, *it's just the way it is.*

MARIANNE:
just the way it is...
yeah i was *actually*, i'm separated, yeah, *kind of* a recent thing

BRANDON:
ok, you were married *for long*?

MARIANNE:
no

WAITER:
did we decide on the wine?

BRANDON:
well, yeah, the pinot, was it the pinot noir you said?

WAITER:
yup, great, great choice

MARIANNE:
i wasn't married long, *gave it a shot*, it didn't really *work out*;

BRANDON:
oh

MARIANNE:
wow

BRANDON:
what?

MARIANNE:
well, you *just seem like*

BRANDON:
what?

MARIANNE:
you *seem* averse to the whole idea

BRANDON:
yeah, well, i *just* don't understand why people *would want to get married*;
especially *nowadays*, i mean, you know, it's...i don't *see the point* in it

MARIANNE:
in relationships?

BRANDON:
it doesn't seem realistic.

MARIANNE:
are you serious? i mean...

BRANDON:
yeah

MARIANNE:

BRANDON:
well...

MARIANNE:
why are you here?

BRANDON:
